




### 2022 ADOPTED SOURCES OF FUNDS\*

# 2022 Tax Levy Summary

Mill levies are set by each taxing authority. The tax actually paid depends on the location and value of the property. This example is for a median-priced home in Fort Collins.

Start with your home's appraised value:

Example = \$408,020

Example = \$408,020



Next, determine your
property's <u>assessed</u> value
[appraised value] x 7.15%

\$408,020 x 7.15%

= \$29,173



Multiply the assessed value by the mill levy and divide by 1,000 to calculate the annual property tax:


 $$29,173 \times 94.738 / 1,000 = $2,763.79$ 



Larimer County's share is 23% or \$632.32 per year


