A trusted, free source of information on the full range of long-term services and support options. Information and referrals to programs, services, and resources for older adults, caregivers and adults living with a disability and help navigating the options.

Options Counseling

One-on-one personalized decision-making assistance to help individuals and their families understand, access, and navigate the long-term service and support system including understanding Long Term Care Medicaid eligibility and the application process, public assistance programs, in-home and community care options, and community resources and services. Support can be provided via phone calls, in-person home visits, or a video conferencing platform. Appointments are required.

Family Caregiver Support Program

For individuals in the caregiver role for an older spouse, partner, parent, or other family member. Provides individual consultations, respite assistance, and connections to support groups, counseling and classes. Support can be provided via phone calls, in-person home visits, or a video conferencing platform. Appointments are required.

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Caregiver Respite Voucher Program

For caregivers who are providing informal in-home care to an older adult age 60 or older, or to an individual with Alzheimer's disease or related neurocognitive disorders. The intent of the Respite Voucher is to alleviate the stresses associated with being a caregiver. Call for more information about this program.

Grand Family Respite Voucher Program

For caregivers 55 years or older providing informal in-home care who are grandparent(s), stepgrandparent(s), or older adult(s) who are relative caregivers of a child by blood, marriage, or adoption. The child must be seventeen (17) years old or younger. The intent of the Grand Family Respite Voucher is to alleviate the stresses associated with being a caregiver. Chore Voucher Program

For adults 60+ residing in Larimer County to help with chores around the home and deep cleaning. The Chore Voucher program is a self-directed reimbursement program that provides some financial assistance for older adults 60+ who need assistance with household chores. Call for more information about this program.



CLASSES FOR CAREGIVERS

Powerful Tools for Caregivers

A program for family caregivers designed to help caregivers take care of themselves while caring for a friend or relative. Provides tools to better communicate feelings, deal with difficult emotions and helps caregivers find relevant resources. The class meets weekly for six weeks. Call 970-498-7758 for more information.

Stress-Busting for Family Caregivers

A nine-week program focused on reducing stress for those caring for a person living with dementia or a chronic illness. Small groups meet weekly focusing on stress management techniques, relaxation, and coping strategies. Call 970-498-7758 for more information.

In-Home Services Voucher Program

Provides light housekeeping and personal care for adults 60+ living in Larimer County who need assistance in their home due to cognitive and/or physical limitations. The Office on Aging contracts with local home care agencies who provide the services. Call for more information about this program.

Application Assistance

Provided to help individuals complete and submit an application for Long Term Care Medicaid and/or Medicare Savings Programs benefits. Support can be provided via phone calls, in-person home visits, or a video conferencing platform. Appointments are required.

Transition Services Options Counseling

Options Counseling for individuals with Long Term Care Medicaid benefits who are currently residing in a skilled nursing home in Larimer County and want to explore their options of moving back to the community from the nursing home with Transition Services.

A team of trained, certified and experienced advocates who investigate and resolve complaints regarding resident rights, quality of life, and quality of care in assisted living and skilled nursing communities. Adult Protective Services receives reports of mistreatment or neglect of at-risk adults who, due to age or disability, are unable to advocate for themselves. Following an assessment, Adult Protective Services will make referrals to implement services to reduce risk and prevent further mistreatment.



PUBLIC ASSISTANCE PROGRAMS

Old Age Pension (OAP)

Old Age Pension provides financial assistance to residents ages 60 or older with little or no income. It may also provide medical assistance for eligible applicants. Eligibility and benefit amounts are based upon the individual's income and resources.

Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP) Food Assistance Program (970) 498-6300

SNAP is a food assistance program in Colorado that provides food benefits to low-income individuals. Benefits are issued on an electronic benefit transfer (EBT) card which can be used at most grocery stores and some farmers markets to buy food.

Aid to the Needy Disabled (AND)

Colorado's Aid to the Needy Disabled (State AND) program provides a cash payment to qualified residents who are between the ages of 18-59, a United States citizen or a legal resident of the United States, a resident of Colorado, cooperate with alcohol or controlled substance programs, remain substance free if your disability primary diagnosis is drug or alcohol addiction and have been, or expect to be totally disabled for six months or more. If you would like an application mailed to you, please call the Larimer County Department of Human Services.

Burial and Cremation Assistance

The Burial Assistance Program provides financial assistance to eligible, low-income Larimer County residents to help with the cost of a funeral, burial, or cremation for individuals whose estates do not have sufficient resources to pay the cost. MEDICAID

Program allows adults with a disability who qualify to "buy-into" Colorado Medicaid. If you work and earn too much to qualify for Colorado Medicaid, you may qualify for this program. If you qualify, you pay a monthly premium which is based on your income. Call for more information.

Long Term Care Medicaid

Includes nursing facility care and Home and Community Based Services (HCBS) (where medical providers come into the home or assisted living community to render the necessary services to keep a disabled individual from being institutionalized in a nursing facility). To apply for Long Term Care Medicaid, please mark the medical assistance box on the application.

A waiver is an extra set of Health First Colorado (Colorado's Medicaid Program) benefits that you may qualify for in certain cases. These benefits can help you remain in your home and community.

In Colorado, HCBS offers the following adult waivers:

Brain Injury Waiver (BI)

For individuals with a brain injury who need extra support to live in their communities.

Community Mental Health Supports Waiver (CMHS)

Provides assistance to people with a mental illness that require long-term supports and services in order to remain in a community setting.

Developmental Disabilities Waiver (DD)

For persons with a developmental disability. Provides access to 24/7 supervision through residential habilitation and day habilitation services and supports.

Elderly, Blind, & Disabled Waiver (EBD)

Provides assistance for people age 65 and older who have a functional impairment or are blind, and to people ages 18-64 who are physically disabled or have a diagnosis of HIV or AIDS, and require long-term supports and services in order to remain in a community setting.

Complementary and Integrative Health (CIH)

For persons living with a spinal cord injury, multiple sclerosis, brain injury, spina bifida, muscular dystrophy or cerebral palsy with the inability for independent ambulation over the age of 18.

Supported Living Services Waiver (SLS)

Provides necessary services and supports for adults with an intellectual or developmental disability so they can remain in their homes and communities.

MEDICARE

Medicare is a health insurance program for people 65+, those under age 65 with qualifying disabilities or any individual with end-stage renal disease. If you do not have credible coverage, you must apply for Medicare benefits the month before you turn 65. You can apply for Medicare 3 months before turning 65 years old.

Colorado Deferred Property Tax

Property tax deferment for seniors, active military personnel, and those who exceed the property taxgrowth cap of 4%, averaged from the preceding two years, to help them continue to afford to live in their homes.

Senior Homestead Exemption

Qualifying Larimer County seniors are eligible for a tax exemption on 50 percent of the first \$200,000 in value of their primary residence. The Larimer County Office on Aging is the Area Agency on Aging for Larimer County and serves adults 60 and beyond, adults living with a disability, and caregivers. LCOA plays a unique role not only to provide direct services and fund community partners, but to innovate and advocate to meet the growing needs of the community.

Aging and Disability Resources for Colorado (ADRC)

The Aging and Disability Resources for Colorado (ADRC) is a trusted source of information for older adults, persons living with a disability, and their caregivers to obtain assistance in planning for their future long-term service and support needs. The ADRC is designed to empower older adults and persons living with a disability to make informed choices about their services and supports. Staff at the ADRC provide objective information and assistance to help people access private or publicly funded programs.

AGING AND DISABILITY RESOURCES FOR COLORADO (ADRC) DIRECT SUPPORT

78 individuals received hands-on assistance in completing a Long-Term Care Medicaid or Medicare Savings Program Application.

112 individuals received one-on-one decision-making assistance to access and navigate long-term services and supports.

7,448 incoming contacts were received requesting assistance, **621** incoming contacts per month on average.

VOUCHER PROGRAMS

114 individuals received **8,835 hours** of homemaker and personal care services.

110 individuals received a chore voucher providing financial support with chores around the home that they were unable to perform, equaling a total of **\$36,136**.

86 individuals received **\$56,609** in financial support for dental/oral health services.

FAMILY CAREGIVER SUPPORT PROGRAM

98 caregivers received respite support valued at **\$110,112**.

122 caregivers received individual caregiver consult sessions.

11 grand families received respite support valued at **\$6,293**.

25 caregivers participated in the evidence-based classes Powerful Tools for Caregivers and Stress-Busting Program for Family Caregivers.

LCOA has an advisory council composed of community members and representatives from community organizations. Thank you to the council members for their time, effort, and dedication to making Larimer County a great place for older adults to live and thrive.

The Ombudsman Program

The Ombudsman team protects the rights of individuals living in nursing and assisted living homes. Larimer County has four fulltime paid Ombudsmen and one volunteer who serve residents in **49 different long-term care communities.**

2,953 individual beds were protected by the Ombudsman Program.

622 visits were made to long-term care communities, **1,386** complaints were investigated, and **668** cases were opened.

443 consultations with facilities and **450 consultations** with residents/families.

42 sessions of community training and **27 sessions** of facility training were provided.



Grant-Funded Community Programs

The Office on Aging funds services through a network of partner agencies. More than **\$2.1 million** was awarded to **33 community organizations** in support of programs and services.

18 individuals received **3,067 hours** of supervised personal care, group engagement, and more through adult day programs.

814 individuals received **96,581** home delivered meals.

591 individuals received **20,260** congregate/grab-n-go meals.

127 clients received low vision services.

315 individuals received **820 hours** of legal assistance.

642 individuals received 20,530 rides.

Phyllis McKeown, a volunteer for SAINT Volunteer Transportation, was honored during the 2023 Older American Month Awards. Funding from LCOA, and the dedication of incredible volunteers like Phyllis, enabled SAINT to provide 14,616 rides to 485 individuals in Larimer County.

Funding

Participants are not charged for services, but are encouraged to donate to the programs they use. Donations go back into the program to expand services. Internal LCOA programs received **\$580 in donations,** while our funded community partners received **\$195,947 for a total of \$196,527.**
