Medford Recovery Project

- Collaboration with Community Partners to develop full continuum of support for families whose substance use disorders and housing insecurity put them at high risk of Child Welfare involvement and/or removal of their children.
- Core Design team includes LCDHS, SummitStone, Larimer County Health Department, Housing Catalyst, Willow Collective, Larimer County Sherriff's Office and Community Corrections
- Contracted with Abt Associates to assist in development of "Roadmap" that includes data analytics, incorporation of various community assessments, stakeholder engagement and co-design focus groups, including those with lived expertise.
- Continuum could include:
 - Site Based Housing with on-site services and supports
 - Access to Transitional Housing opportunities
 - Coordinated and enhanced Out-Patient Therapeutic interventions
 - Family Based Residential Program either local, or in collaboration with Wings in Weld County



Kechter Affordable Condos Project

- County contribution would be used to help fill \$2.6M financing gap created by rise in construction costs
- 70% AMI for a family of 4 is \$75,110 (total housing payment <\$2065.52)
- Homeowner's proceeds, at sale, are determined by adding 25% of the appreciation to their initial purchase price + realtor commission and fees + forced savings
- Community Land Trust
 - Mission aligned to permanent affordable housing; nonprofit
 - Owns land; 99-year lease with homeowner, which includes fee of \$100/month
 - · Pays for services and property taxes
 - Cannot be raised more than 2% every 3 years



Immediate Needs Grants Financial Update

- Immediate Needs Grant Progress:
 - \$2.7 million in funding distributed*
 - \$389K remaining to be disbursed
 - 41 of 52 projects fully reimbursed*
 - 5 projects expire 3/31/23
 - 2 projects expire 6/30/23
 - 4 projects expire 12/31/23



4th Quarter Project and Expenditure Report

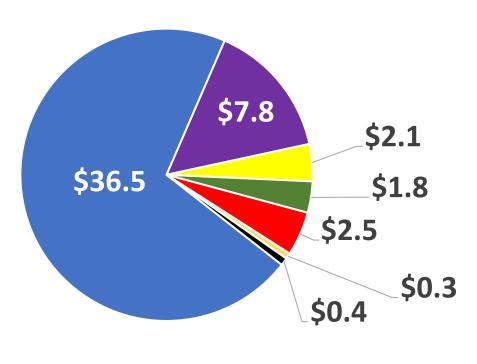
- Submitted to U.S. Treasury Dept. on January 27th
- \$37.6 million in costs reported for 4th quarter
 - \$36.5 million in lost revenue from 2020 and 2021
 - \$561k for payroll for CJA (\$311k recyclable)*
 - \$412k for Immediate Needs Grants
 - \$54k for Sheriff Inmate Medical Care
 - \$41k for District Attorney Prosecutor Position
 - \$15K for Administrative Costs*
 - \$9K for Vicarious Trauma

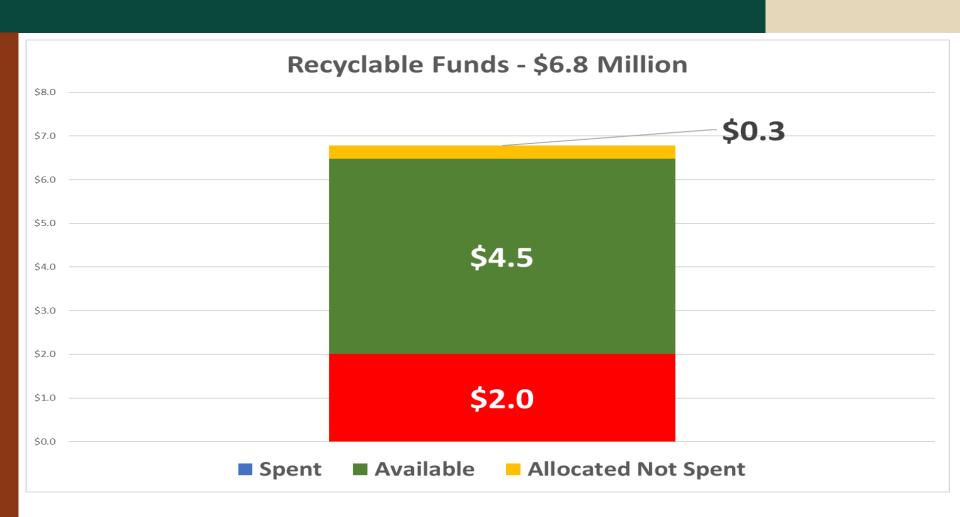

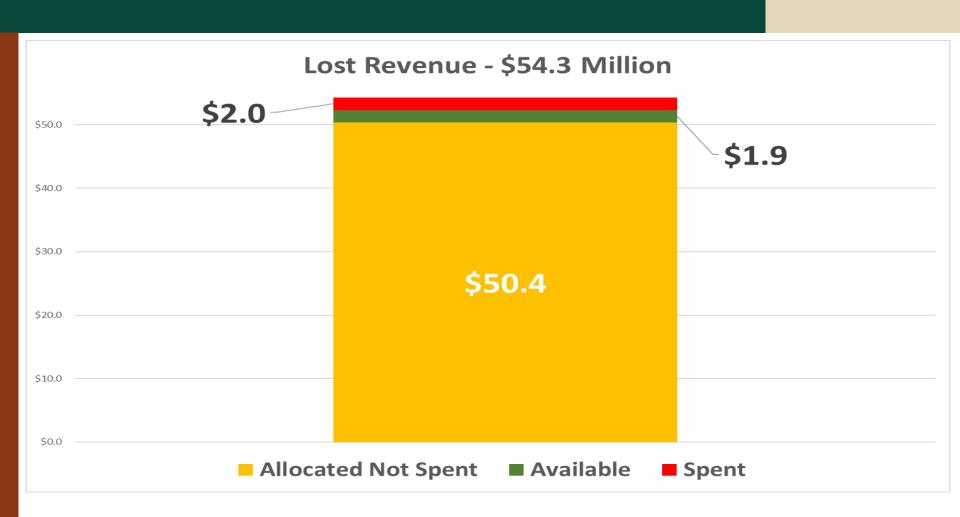






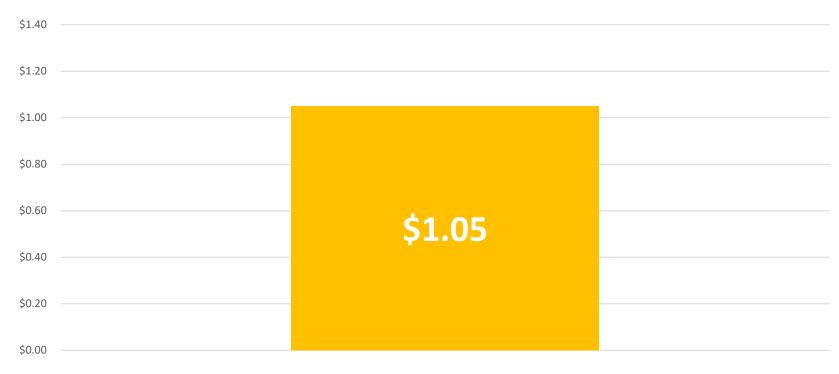








Fund Interest - \$1.05 Million
