To vote for a named candidate, completely fill in the oval to the left of your choice. Use blue or black ink.



To make a correction, draw a bold line through the oval and candidate name marked by mistake, then fill in the oval next to the correct name.

Return only one ballot. If your mail ballot packet contains ballots for both the Democratic and Republican Parties, mark and return only one ballot, and destroy the other. If you mark and return both ballots, neither will count.

There are two races for Representative to the United States Congress - District 4 on this ballot. You may vote in both races.
