About BHS



In 2018, Larimer County voters passed a **20-year ballot initiative** that dedicates a .25% sales-and-use tax (\$0.25 on \$100) for behavioral health purposes.

Behavioral Health: Includes both mental health and substance use, encompassing a continuum of prevention, intervention, treatment and recovery support services for overall well-being.

BHS utilizes two funding pathways to invest back into the community.

- 1 Behavioral Health Services at Longview Campus
- **2** Impact Fund Grant Program



BHS Mission: Responsibly investing in community-driven work to increase access to behavioral health services and improve outcomes for all Larimer County community members.

The Impact Fund allows Larimer County to **invest directly** into behavioral health programs that serve the needs of our community.

BHS utilizes community-informed decision-making through **three advisory groups**, each representing a valuable perspective on behavioral health.





Advisory Groups

Behavioral Health Policy Council (BHPC) - Elected officials, At-Large Members, and a Commissioner Liaison

Technical Advisory Committee (TAC) - Professionals in the field of behavioral health

Consumer Advisory Committee (CAC) - Individuals with lived experience navigating behavioral health systems





Become a member of a BHS Advisory Group:

- Members serve a three-year term starting in December
- Regular participation in meetings
- Community liaison
- Work to define targeted projects for focused funding through the Grant Program



- Organization's Most Current Balance Sheet
- Most recent audited financial statements (if applicable)

Returning Applicants do not need to reupload the W9 or EIN Letter, unless something has changed

All Financial documents need to be updated on an annual basis

RESPONSIVE GRANTS

Available to organizations that work to support the behavioral health of community members, align with our funding priorities, but do not fall into a Targeted Grant area.

*Alternatives & Interventions in Criminal Justice: Gary A. Darling Grant Award

Grant awarded to programs that attempt to disentangle behavioral health and criminal justice, reduce recidivism, offer reentry programming, or community-based competency restoration support.

Gary Darling served the Larimer County Sheriff's Office for 30 years and then the Criminal Justice Division. Served as a member of the Mental Health and Substance Use Alliance and on the guidance team for the the 2018 Behavioral Health ballot initiative.




What organizations are being funded?

How big are the grants?








What's being funded?

How competitive is it?

- In 2023, the number of applications increased **42%** (55 to 78 applications)
- In 2023, the total amount requested increased 48% (\$5.1M to \$7.5M)

Award Data & Trends

- Most grants are below \$150k
- The median and average award size is increasing (~\$80k)
- In general, the number of awards has been between 35-42 each year
- Roughly half of the awards each year have been partial awards (i.e. not awarded in full)
