Ballot issues for the State will be mailed separately via the State's "Blue Book."

Further, this Notice does not contain ballot issues for those jurisdictions conducting separate elections. A separate Notice will be mailed to the appropriate voters within the jurisdictions conducting an election by mail or polling place. Voters may receive additional materials from other jurisdictions conducting independent elections.

A General Election will be held on Tuesday, November 8, 2022, between the hours of 7 AM and 7 PM.

The election will be conducted as a mail ballot election. Ballot materials will be mailed during <u>the week of</u> October 17, 2022, to every active, registered voter.

Voted ballots may be returned by mail (postage is 60 cents) or hand delivered to a designated ballot drop box location or a Voter Service and Polling Center.

After October 31, 2022, it is recommended that voters personally deliver their ballot to any of the drop box or Voter Service and Polling Center locations listed in the following pages of this Notice.

Ballots must be RECEIVED at the Larimer County Elections Office, a designated ballot drop box location or a Voter Service and Polling Center by 7 PM on Election Day, Tuesday, November 8, 2022.

Ballots received after 7 PM on Election Day will not be counted. **Postmarks do not** count as a received date.

Ballot Title and Text:

BALLOT ISSUE 3F

SHALL TOWN OF WINDSOR TAXES BE INCREASED BY \$1.62 MILLION ANNUALLY BEGINNING IN TAX COLLECTION YEAR 2023, AND BY WHATEVER AMOUNTS THAT MAY BE GENERATED THEREAFTER, BY INCREASING THE TOWN SALES AND USE TAX RATE BY 0.25% (2.5 CENTS ON A TEN-DOLLAR PURCHASE) FROM THE CURRENT RATE OF 3.95% TO A NEW RATE OF 4.2% ON JANUARY 1, 2023, WITH TAX REVENUE TO BE USED FOR THE CREATION OF A DEDICATED FUNDING SOURCE FOR OPEN SPACE LAND ACQUISITION, STEWARDSHIP, OPERATION AND MAINTENANCE THAT WILL:

- PURCHASE AND MAINTAIN OPEN SPACE FROM WILLING LANDOWNERS THAT
 ACHIEVES THE FOLLOWING:
 - ENSURING ACQUIRED OPEN SPACE LAND WILL REMAIN UNDEVELOPED AND LESSEN THE IMPACT OF RESIDENTIAL HOUSING GROWTH, THEREBY REDUCING COMMUNITY IMPACTS SUCH AS TRAFFIC, THE COST OF MAINTAINING ROADS, SEWER, STORMWATER AND ACQUIRING AND TREATING WATER
 - ENABLE THE TOWN TO DEVELOP AND MAINTAIN OPEN SPACE THAT WILL INCREASE PUBLIC RECREATION OPPORTUNITIES
 - OBTAIN, MANAGE AND PRESERVE WORKING FARMS AND COMMUNITY SEPARATORS THAT WILL KEEP WINDSOR UNIQUE FROM NEIGHBORING CITIES AND TOWNS
 - PROMOTE AND PERPETUATE OPEN SPACE THAT CONSERVES VALUABLE WILDLIFE HABITATS, PROTECTS THE ENVIRONMENT AND CREATES GREEN SPACES AND WATERFRONT ACCESS TO LAKES, STREAMS, AND THE CACHE LA POUDRE RIVER

Summaries of written comments filed with the election officer:

The following summaries were prepared from comments filed by persons FOR Ballot Issue 3F:

The passage of measure 3F, the proposed Town of Windsor Open Space sales tax, will provide dedicated funding to save our beautiful natural areas, farms, grasslands, bluffs, and Cache la Poudre River corridor. A yes vote on 3F will lessen the impact of residential growth, preserve wildlife habitat, secure land for open space and trails, and protect our water and quality of life for future generations to come.

The Town of Windsor is growing at a rate of 4.12% annually, putting Windsor on track to grow by an additional 17,700 people over the next ten years-nearly a 50% increase from today's population. A Yes vote on 3F will drastically decrease Windsor's future population growth and increase where you play and how you enjoy your open space. Join us in planning ahead to lessen the impact of residential growth. We need to plan ahead to lessen the impact of this growth. Windsor currently relies on private residential and commercial development dedicating portions of their land to the Town for open space and trail corridors.

The passing of 3F will secure funding that will allow the Town of Windsor to proactively purchase open space before it is all developed. A yes vote on 3F will protect, preserve, and maintain the rural character of our community. A yes vote on 3F will maintain the community separators and open spaces that keep Windsor unique from neighboring cities and towns. A yes vote on 3F will preserve the small-town character and quality of life in Windsor you have grown to love and enjoy.

Windsor is home to unique and diverse wildlife like owls, hawks, bald eagles, deer, and wild turkey. A yes vote on 3F will help preserve valuable wildlife habitat for generations to come. We must protect what we can to ensure additional wildlife habitat is not lost to a growing community.

There are several benefits to the Windsor community from a healthy system of open spaces, including reducing the cost of obtaining and treating water, helping to filter stormwater, providing flood mitigation, lowering temperatures, improving air quality, absorbing carbon emissions, and reducing soil erosion:

A yes vote on 3F will:

- Lessen the impact of residential housing growth
- Increase public recreation opportunities
- Protect lands that preserve water quality in rivers, lakes and streams
- Protect our quality of life
- Conserve natural areas
- Conserve wildlife habitat
- Ensure farms and ranches can continue to be working landscapes instead of being developed
- Provide options for willing farm and ranch families to realize profit from their land while preserving the heritage and history of their properties
