Fiscal Factors

Year of Reductions:

- Pressures on State and Federal Partners
- Residential Property Values Have Flattened
- Property Tax Revenues are Capped
- \$6 Million Budget Gap





Key Decisions: Closing the \$6M Gap

Identified General Fund Savings:

- \$3.4 million in reductions
- **\$310,000** in new revenues
- \$700,000 less than expected service proposals





Key Decisions: Closing the \$6M Gap

Reduce Operating Budgets in Recording, Motor Vehicle, and Elections	\$622,000
Shift Eviction Prevention to Federal Funding Source	\$439,000
Reduce Employee Stipends / Workers Compensation Wage Continuation	\$185,000
Eliminate Funding for HomeShare & Larimer Home Improvement Program	\$105,000
Reduce Support for Consolidate, and Eliminate Advisory Boards	\$100,000
Board of County Commissioners Reductions	\$92,532
Scale Back Community Wildfire Mitigation Grant Program	\$50,000
ADA Capital Budget Reduction	\$50,000
Eliminate Small-Business Sustainability Program	\$45,000
Shift Radio Console Replacement Costs to Larimer Emergency Telephone Authority	\$36,000



Key Decisions: Closing the \$6M Gap

New General Fund Revenues	2026 Budget Savings
Short Term Rental License Renewal	\$50,000
Morgue Facility Use Fee Increases	\$10,000
Partner with Other Local Governments to Share Software Costs	\$250,000



Key Decisions: Service Proposals

General Fund Service Proposals:

- \$14 Million requested
- \$4.8 Million included in the 2026 Proposed Budget
 - **\$2.3 Million Ongoing** (\$700k below forecast)
 - \$2.5 Million One-time

Funded requests were largely for one-time capital needs, meeting existing obligations, efficiency gains, and strategic priorities.

Key Decisions: One-Time Proposals

General Fund Service Proposals: One-Time	Amount
Facility Security Modernization (IT Capital)	\$2,322,000
New Judge's Chambers (Facilities Capital)	\$70,000
Property Abatements/Cleanups	\$125,000
Regional Workforce Marketing – NOCO REDI	\$25,000



Key Decisions: Capital Improvement Plan

Major Projects:

- Emergency Services Building
- Ranch Master Plan
- North Landfill and Transfer Station
- Larimer County Transportation Master Plan





Key Decisions: Unfunded Needs

What's **NOT** in the Budget

- Major Justice Center Facility Needs (\$200M+)
- Unfunded Road Capacity (\$17M annual)
- Unfunded Service Proposals (\$9M)


General Fund Balance Projection
