Local Assistance and Tribal Consistency Funds (LATCF)

- Larimer County to receive \$1.3 million between federal FY 2022 and 2023
- <u>NO</u> deadline to expend funds
- Generally similar to Federal Payment in Lieu of Taxes
 - Formula based on federal acreage & economic conditions (historic poverty levels, unemployment, etc.)
- Deadline to apply is January 31, 2023
- 1st tranche paid within a week after submitting application
- 2nd tranche paid sometime in 2023



Local Assistance and Tribal Consistency Funds (LATCF)

- Can use for any governmental activity other than lobbying.
 - Capital projects
 - Grant matches
 - Government operations
 - LATCF administration
 - Basically, anything except lobbying
- Costs incurred after March 15, 2021



Local Assistance and Tribal Consistency Funds (LATCF)

- Davis-Bacon does not apply;
- Does not trigger National Environmental Policy Act (NEPA) analysis;
- Subject to Build America, Buy America Act with waiver if used within 6 months of receipt
- Annual obligation and expenditure reports required by March 31 every year
- Reports required until funds are expended.



Immediate Needs Grants Financial Update

- Immediate Needs Grant Progress:
 - \$2.1 million in reimbursements requested
 - \$2.1 million in funding distributed*
 - 32 projects fully reimbursed*

How Larimer County Immediate Needs Grants Helped Our Community

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During the COVID-19 pandemic, Larimer County Immediate Needs Grants [LCING] were a lifeline for people and organizations in our community. Larimer County distributed \$3.1 million to small businesses, non-profits, and local government to help our community recover from the effects of the pandemic. These grants are funded by the County's allocation from the <u>State and Local Fiscal Recovery Fund</u> , which is part of the <u>American Rescue Plan Act</u>.

The grants have been divided into three categories:

Health Impacts - Public Health

- Recovery from the Health Impacts of the pandemic \$673,000
- · Recovery from the Economic impacts of the pandemic \$2.26 million
- Improvements to Infrastructure to help communities prevent future pandemics \$167,500


- Allocation Changes since September:

 - +\$16,050 for Vicarious Trauma Training in Office of the Coroner
 - +\$603,445 for services in Community Justice Alternatives in 2023




- Allocation Changes since September:
 - +\$118,199 for Budget Analyst in 2023
 - +\$250,000 for KidsPAK facility contribution*
 - -\$250,000 for Landlord Engagement grant match
 - +\$1,500,000 for Land Bank purchase*
 - +\$2,00,000 Poudre Commons Development*






