Current Tobacco Use (any use in the past 30 days)



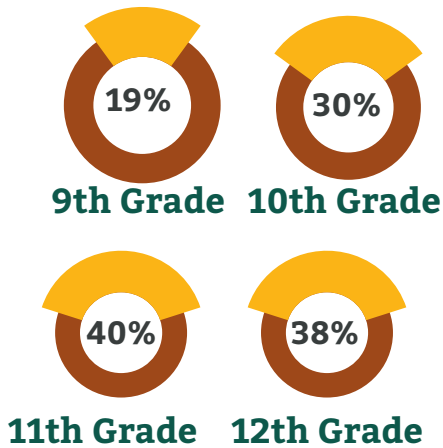

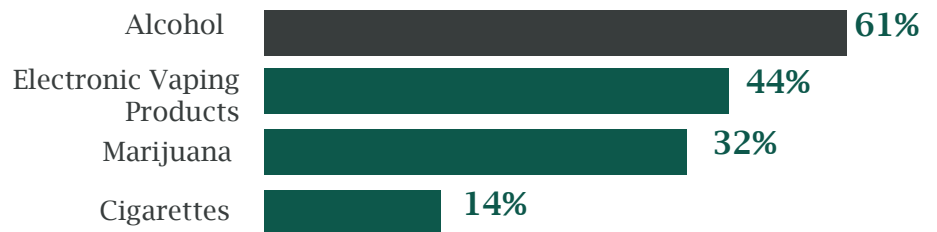

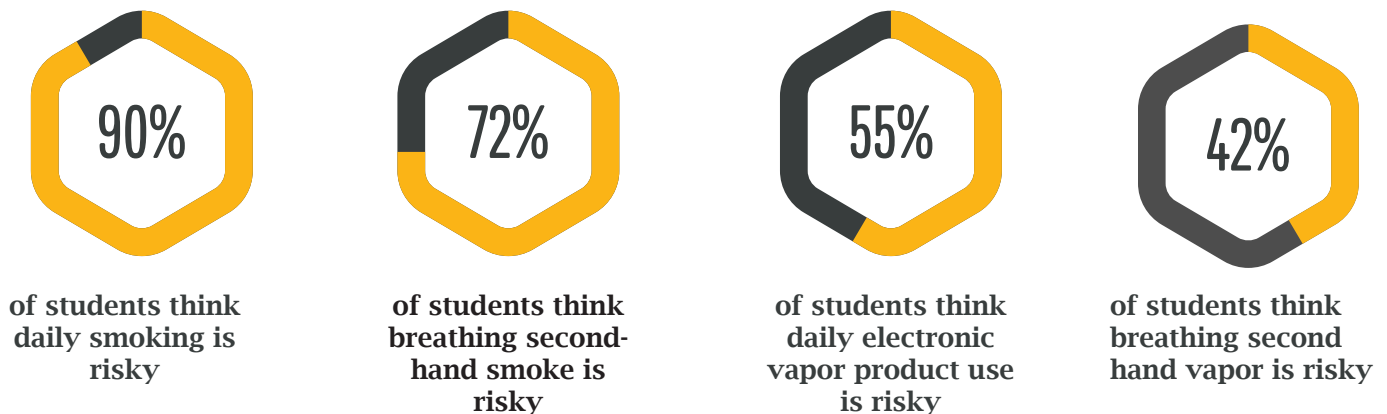
Current Electronic Vapor Use by Grade



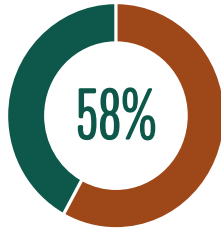
Electronic Vapor Products are the second most tried substance among Larimer County students



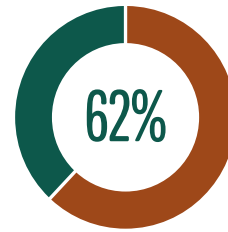
