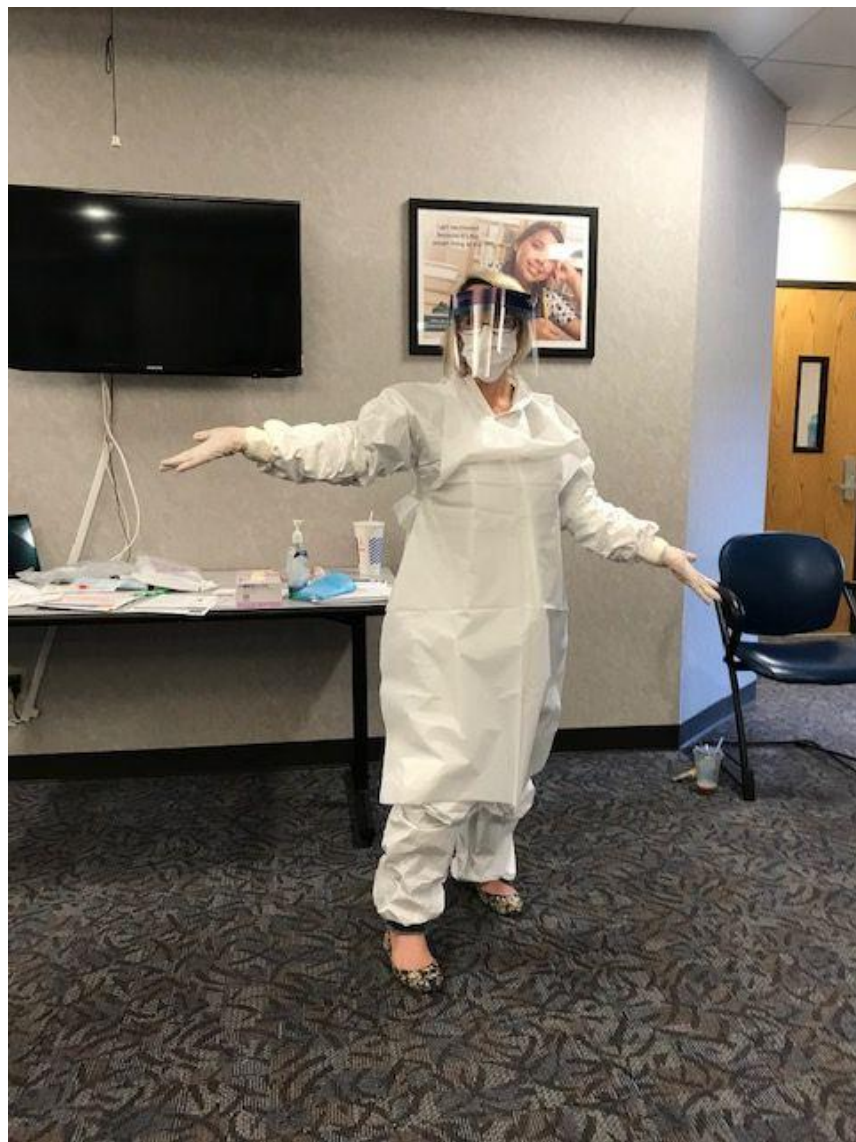

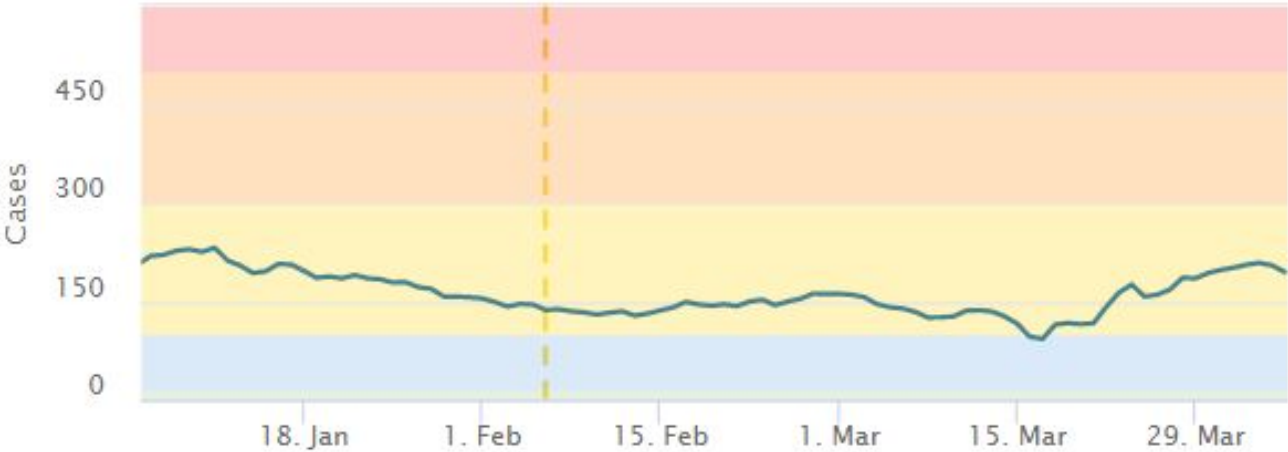


# COVID-19 Dashboard

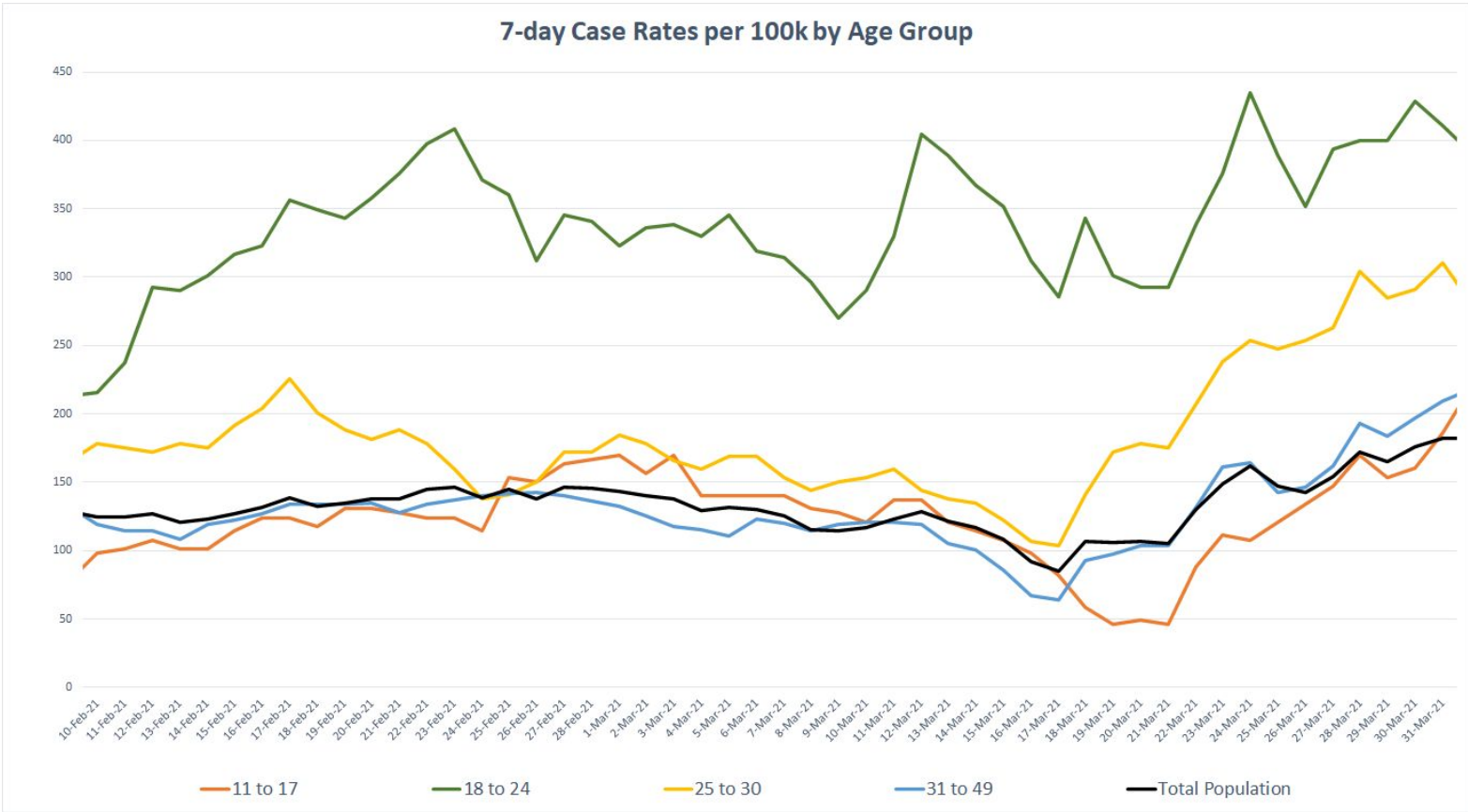
## Cases/100k: 7-Day Rate

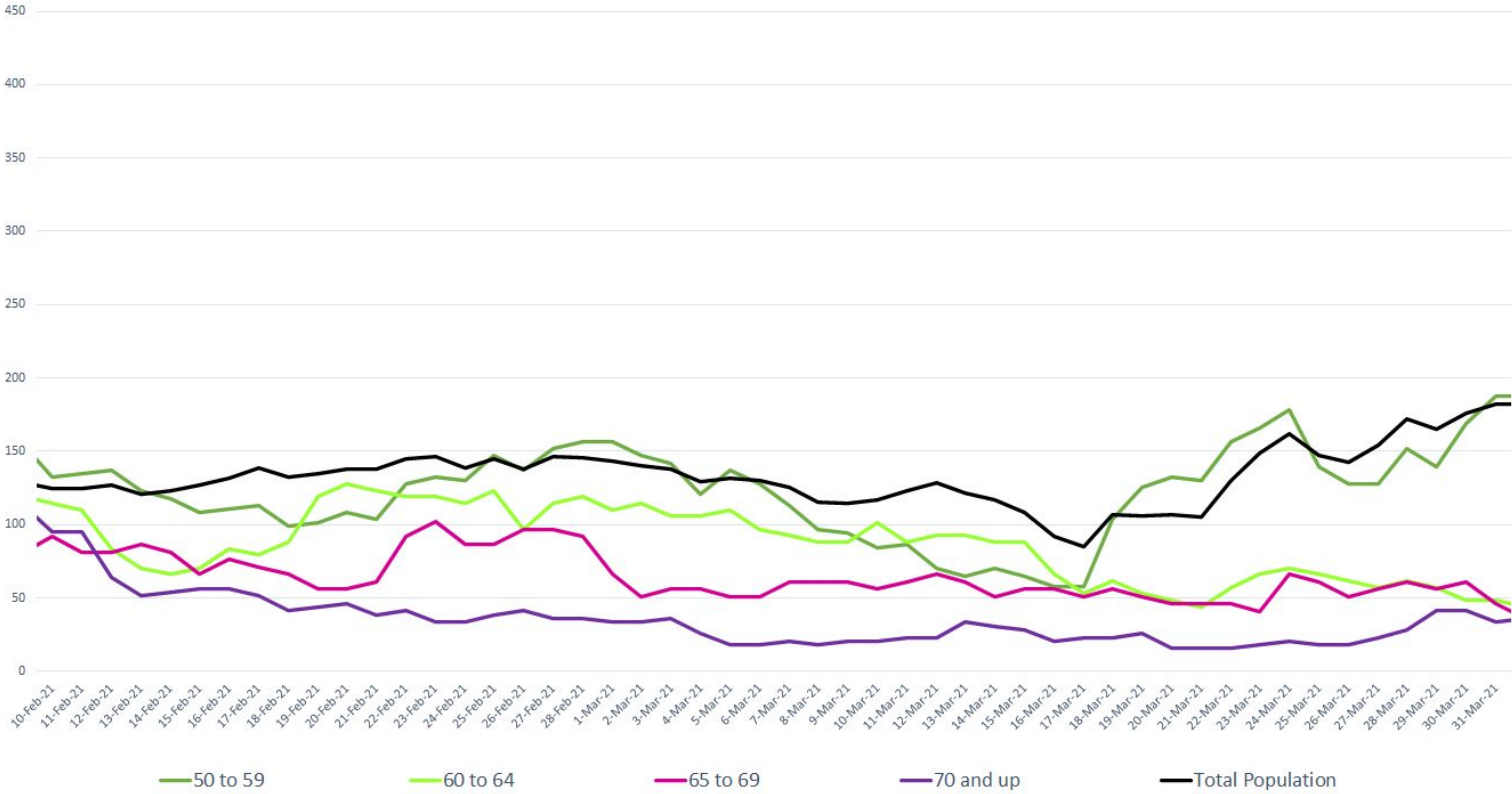

7-day Case Rates per 100k by Age Group



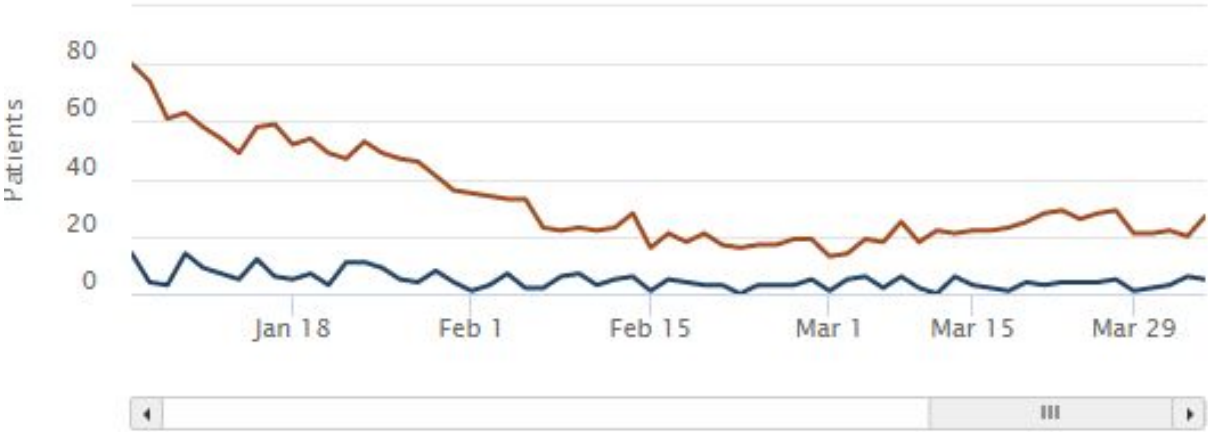
