


Larimer County moved to Orange at noon on <u>Jan. 4</u>.





Cases/100K: 14-Day Rate






Patterns in Case Rate Post-Holidays



As cases increased, so did COVID deaths.




More than half of the total COVID deaths in Larimer County were in November and December.

Highest-risk health care workers and individuals:

- · People who have direct contact with COVID-19 patients for 15 minutes or more over a 24-hour period.
- · Long-term care facility staff and residents.

1B

Coloradans age 70+, moderate-risk health care workers, first responders, frontline essential workers, and continuity of state government:

- · Health care workers with less direct contact with COVID-19 patients (e.g. home health, hospice, pharmacy, dental, etc.) and EMS.
- Firefighters, police, COVID-19 response personnel, correctional workers, and funeral services.
- · People age 70 and older.
- · Frontline essential workers in education, food and agriculture, manufacturing, U.S. postal service, public transit and specialized transportation staff, grocery, public health, frontline essential human service workers, and direct care providers for Coloradans experiencing homelessness.
- Essential officials from executive, legislative and judicial branches of state government.
- · Essential frontline journalists.




Higher-risk individuals and other essential workers:

- People age 60-69.
- · People age 16-59 with obesity, diabetes, chronic lung disease, significant heart disease, chronic kidney disease, cancer, or are immunocompromised.
- · Other essential workers and continuity of local government.
- · Adults who received a placebo during a COVID-19 vaccine clinical trial.




























COVID-19 Vaccine Update



Phase 1A:

- Highest-risk health care workers and individuals
- Long-term care facility staff and residents.

Phase 1B - Above the Line

- Coloradans age 70+, moderate risk health care workers, first responders, EMS, mental health, dental, and hospice providers, etc.
- Firefighters, police, correctional workers, funeral services



Long Term Care Facilities

In Larimer County:

- 54 long term care and other residential facilities were approved for COVID-19 vaccination through the CVS/Walgreens pharmacy partnership
- The 1st round of vaccinations are scheduled to be completed by 1/27/21 at these locations



COVID-19 Vaccine Allocation

CDPHE Vaccine Allocation in Colorado:

- 50% to hospitals and large health systems
- 20% to Federally Qualified Health Centers
- 20% to pharmacies
- 10% to local public health agencies



COVID-19 Vaccine Best Practices

- Administer two doses of Pfizer and Moderna to every recipient eligible:
 - 21 days post initial shot for Pfizer
 - 28 days post initial shot for Moderna

 Providers administering vaccine are being asked to maximize efficiency and ensure that second doses that are not needed for a given week are not held back, but instead are given as first doses.



Goals to Increase Access

- State adding enrolled providers as supply increases
- Public Health coordinating vaccine distribution
- Meeting weekly with all enrolled providers on planned activities for vaccinating priority groups
- Public Health & partners working to offer more clinics, including larger (mass) clinics
- Working to address transportation and access barriers
