Ballot issues for the State will be mailed separately via the State's "Blue Book."

Further, this Notice does not contain ballot issues for those jurisdictions conducting separate elections. A separate Notice will be mailed to the appropriate voters within the jurisdictions conducting an election by mail or polling place. Voters may receive additional materials from other jurisdictions conducting independent elections.

A Coordinated Election will be held on Tuesday, November 2, 2021, between the hours of 7 AM and 7 PM.

The election will be conducted as a mail ballot election. Ballot materials will be mailed during <u>the week of</u> October 11, 2021, to every active, registered voter.

Voted ballots may be returned by mail (postage is 58 cents) or hand delivered to a designated ballot drop-off location or a Voter Service and Polling Center.

After October 25, 2021, it is recommended that voters personally deliver their ballot to any of the drop-off locations listed in the following pages of this Notice.

Ballots must be RECEIVED at the Larimer County Elections Office, a designated ballot drop-off location or a Voter Service and Polling Center by 7 PM on Election Day, Tuesday, November 2, 2021.

Ballots received after 7 PM on Election Day will not be counted. **Postmarks do not** count as a received date.

Ballot Issue 6D

SHALL BERTHOUD COMMUNITY LIBRARY DISTRICT TAXES BE INCREASED \$1,275,000 ANNUALLY FOR COLLECTION BEGINNING IN 2022, AND ANNUALLY THEREAFTER BY AN ADDITIONAL PERCENTAGE EQUAL TO INFLATION PLUS ANNUAL LOCAL GROWTH AS DEFINED IN ART. X, SECTION 20 OF THE COLORADO CONSTITUTION, WITH HALF THE TAX INCREASE EXPIRING AFTER THIRTY YEARS, TO MAINTAIN EXISTING SERVICES AND TO MEET THE INCREASED DEMAND FOR ADDITIONAL SERVICES, WHICH MAY INCLUDE:

CONSTRUCTION OF A NEW, LARGER LIBRARY BUILDING TO MEET GROWING COMMUNITY NEEDS;

SEPARATE SPACES FOR CHILDREN AND TEENS;

NEW COMMUNITY MEETING ROOMS, INNOVATION LAB, AND RECORDING STUDIO;

EXPANDED COMPUTER LAB AND INTERNET CAPACITY FOR PUBLIC USE;

SUPPORTING THE COST OF STAFFING AND GENERAL OPERATIONS;

AND SHALL THE DISTRICT BE AUTHORIZED TO LEVY A PROPERTY TAX AT A RATE SUFFICIENT TO PRODUCE THIS INCREASE, COMMENCING WITH TAXES PAYABLE IN 2022 AND CONTINUING EACH YEAR THEREAFTER (EXPECTED TO RESULT IN A MONTHLY TAX INCREASE OF \$2.97 FOR EACH \$100,000 OF HOME VALUE IN 2022); AND SHALL THE DISTRICT BE ENTITLED TO COLLECT, RETAIN AND SPEND THOSE REVENUES IN ADDITION TO ANY OTHER TAXES, FEES OR OTHER REVENUES OF THE DISTRICT AND NOTWITHSTANDING ANY LIMITATION OR RESTRICTION OF ARTICLE X, SECTION 20 OF THE COLORADO CONSTITUTION, OR WITHOUT REGARD TO THE 5.5% PROPERTY TAX REVENUE LIMITATION OF SECTION 29-1-301, C.R.S. OR ANY OTHER LAW?

Summaries of written comments filed with the election officer:

The following summaries were prepared from comments filed by persons FOR Ballot Issue 6D:

Vote on YES 6D for a NEW, LARGER, COMMUNITY LIBRARY for BERTHOUD.

We Have Outgrown Our Library.

Our small library was built 28 years ago when Berthoud had only 3000 people.

Today, our growth has put our population over 15,000, moving quickly to 20,000 with no slowing in sight. This six-fold population growth has put tremendous strain on our families and community to access library services.

To put it in perspective, our library was built the same year the Colorado Rockies took the field. Aladdin and A Few Good Men were the hit movies of the day and DIA was still two years away from opening.

Over 100 people walk through our library doors daily and the library checks out 143 books or materials a day. And over 2,500 people yearly attend a library sponsored cultural or educational event.

But the library has to routinely turn people away because we don't have enough meeting space, computer terminals or private study/work spaces for students and adults.

The Solution: YES on 6D.

A Great Community like Berthoud deserves a Great Public Library.

YES on 6D = A new, larger library building that will meet the growing community needs in the Berthoud area.

YES on 6D ensures that our new, larger library will have:

- ✓ separate areas for <u>children</u> and <u>teens</u> so they have a <u>safe and healthy</u> learning place
- ✓ new <u>community meeting rooms</u>
- ✓ an innovation lab, and recording studio
- ✓ an expanded computer lab and internet capacity for free public use
- ✓ continually adding <u>best-sellers</u>, classics, audio/E-books and movies all for free.
