





According to the PID brochure obtained at the RFL Open House, Larimer County has 250 miles of road they do not maintain, and 100 miles of road that get minimal maintenance. RFL's county-identified roads should r eceive minimal maintenance based on the recent tax increase on RFL properties. A person broke his leg las t winter trying to get his truck up a hill on Nokomis. Another concern involves the RFL emergency responder s (also not County funded) being able to access the homes/people in this area because of that hill. The wat er and wastewater study was very good but eXpecting taxpayers to pay for county improvements is another element of the county's lack of support for RFL. We are a small community who gets no service from the county but pays it's fair share of taxes. Shame on the county for having the "not our problem" attitude when it comes to the safety of its residents. The County had funds to build a new facility in Livermore; but no funds to minimally maintain a few RFL roads.
