




WILDFIRES IN THE POUDRE WATERSHED - Past 10 years

Post-Fire Sediment Inputs










2021-2022 Overview

- **2021** 5,000+ acres mulched
- 2022 4,100+ acres mulched
- Predominantly on USFS lands, with some state and private






Preliminary Results from Sediment Study


