Red Feather Lakes Public Restroom Project

- This project would replace existing vaulted privies (outhouses) located adjacent to the firehouse.
- There is a lack of public restrooms in the area of Red Feather where most businesses are located. While a larger wastewater treatment facility was studied, identifying a source of funding for the maintenance costs is a barrier to moving forward.
- Funding for maintenance of restroom facilities would be through a local improvement district.
- There is a need to do some planning and site work ahead of a vote for the Local Improvement District (design work for an on-site wastewater treatment system to serve the restrooms, determine costs of construction).
- **Direction sought:** Allocate \$500K to project?

Capital Projects Fund Grant - \$160M

- Projects must meet all the following criteria:
 - The capital project invests in capital assets designed to directly enable work, education and health monitoring.
 - The capital project is designed to address a critical need that resulted from or was made apparent or exacerbated by the COVID-19 public health emergency.
 - The capital project is designed to address a critical need of the community to be served by it.
 - To deploy last-mile broadband infrastructure capable of providing symmetrical 100 Mbps internet access to eligible locations.
 - Eligible locations include those that lack access to reliable, wireline internet access of at least 100/20 Mbps. (25/3 prefer)




Capital Projects Fund Grant

- Application window opens June 12, 2023
- Larimer is Tier 1 County
 - \$120M in Funding Available
 - 25% Local Match
 - Unserved Locations and Middle Mile Costs
- Application deadline is August 11, 2023
- Award notices sent November 5, 2023



Capital Projects Fund Grant

Tier I and Tier II Counties



County Tier



Tier I Counties are counties selected by the Colorado Broadband Office (CBO) based on the percent of households with a broadband subscription and the percent and total number of households with broadband available and other factors as determined by the CBO.



USDA Community Connect Grant

- Application window is open
- Limited Areas Qualify (25/3) Rural areas that lack any existing broadband speed of at least 25 Mbps downstream and 3 Mbps upstream are eligible.
 - Big Thompson Canyon
 - Upper Poudre Canyon
- 15% Match
- Projects are \$2-5M
- Application deadline is June 20, 2023



Grant Participation Discussion—Local Match

25% Match requirement will drive the number projects we can apply for.

- County General Fund

2023 1st Quarter Project & Expenditure Report

- Submitted April 12th, 2023
- \$349K in reported expenditures
 - \$253K Immediate Needs Grants
 - \$54K Jail Inmate Medical Care
 - \$37K for District Attorney Complex Case Prosecution Position
 - \$4,600 for Vicarious Trauma Training
- Community Justice Alternatives canceling Pre-Trial Services LTE (-\$53K allocation)
- \$51.9 million of \$69.3 million has been reported spent
 - \$16.7 million to be allocated to lost revenue for CY 2022
 - \$800K+ direct SLFRF to be reimbursed




Immediate Needs Grants Financial Update


- Immediate Needs Grant Progress:
 - \$2.76 million in funding distributed*
 - \$299K remaining to be disbursed
 - 46 of 52 projects fully reimbursed or expired
 - 2 projects expire 6/30/23
 - 4 projects expire 12/31/23





















Local Asst & Tribal Consistency Fund - \$1.3 Million
