Behavioral Health Urgent Care is available 8 a.m. to midnight, 7 days a week, or call for Mobile Response any time, anywhere in Larimer County. Crisis teams will provide triage, consultation, crisis intervention, behavioral health assessment, and referral to appropriate levels of care. Crisis interventions by phone, Behavioral Health Urgent Care or Mobile Response are available for all individuals seeking behavioral health crisis support and/or referral to ongoing care. Caregiver and guardian involvement will be discussed as appropriate to youth seeking assistance.

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
